Set in a land of snow and ice, this fable based on a Russian folk tale, finds the wood carver, Ivanovitch, and his wife, Maroosha, wishing for a child of their own. The rest of the story is told in dialogue and through dancing, with the Snow Girl facing challenges and learning what it is like to be human and living in a real family.
